Grand Opening of the Historical Society Center
On April 11, 2007

The Palm Coast Historical Society was formed when the City Council, in 2000, appointed Margaret Davie and Art Dycke as Co-Historians. Margaret became the first President and Art the first Vice President. Art Dycke is now the official Palm Coast City Historian, on the Board of Directors, and Margaret is a Lifetime Honoree Member.

The By-Laws of the Historical Society state "The purpose of the Historical Society is to promote and foster the study of the history of The City of Palm Coast, Florida. To accomplish this, the Society shall serve as an educational and historical organization in The City of Palm Coast."

The former building of the Flagler County Library in Palm Harbor shopping area became Palm Coast's City Hall and they saved 2 rooms for our very first office. When the city's staff required additional space we moved all of our office to a storage building on PC Parkway. Our next move was to USA Storage on Pine Lakes Parkway because the rental cost was lower. Then we moved to 3 Hargrove Grade to a building rented by Family Matters. In August, 2004 we once again moved because the building was going to be padlocked due to nonpayment of rent by Family Matters. All of our data and office furniture was again placed in storage at USA Storage located behind Wal-Mart.

Oh Happy Day! Our, we hope but not likely, final move was the end of January 2007 to a room constructed in the warehouse of the current Palm Coast City Hall. The Palm Coast Historical Society Center grand opening was April 11, 2007!

There are three people we all must say a huge thank you to for their hard work in preparing for the opening. The people listed below worked every afternoon on Tuesday and Thursday, February thru the beginning of April assembling furniture, placing Palm Coast history data into boxes, hanging pictures etc to prepare the Center for the Grand Opening Day. A Certificate of Appreciation was presented to each of them at the Palm Coast Outback Steakhouse fundraiser luncheon September 12.

# April 11, 2007 Dedication of the Palm Coast Historical Society Center By Debby Geyer

The Historical Society Center is being dedicated the memory of Mary Ann Canfield and Robert Crocetta.

Mary Ann was among the first members of the Palm Coast Historical Society and one of the Society's first Directors. Art Dycke, City Historian, wrote an article for our October thru December 2004 newsletter titled "A Tribute to Mary Ann Canfield" which best describes her interest in preserving the history of Palm Coast. "Mary Ann was a guiding force of the Historical Society even before it was officially organized. Upon the appointment of myself and Margaret Davie as City Co-Historians in April 200, she provided us with the names of long time residents to contact for our audio taped interviews and she participated in some of the tapings. Mary Ann typed the forms and popularized our 'Who Was the First in Palm Coast' history Mary Ann became Vice President in January 2002 when I became President. She passed away in the summer of 2004.

I want to end on a light note so I will tell you how Mary Ann and I became officers. When Margaret Davie announced she was stepping down as President Mary Ann suggested I be nominated as President. I replied "oh no I can't do that". Well, she then began to address me as Madam President whenever she called me or saw me. Finally I said okay BUT only if you will be Vice President!

Bob Crocetta was also among the first members of the Palm Coast Historical Society and the Society's first Treasurer and remained Treasure until three months prior to his passing on December 6, 2006. Once again Art Dycke wrote an article for our newsletter issued January through March 2007 titled "A Tribute to Bob Crocetta 2005 Citizen of the Year" which best describes his interest and involvement in all facets of Palm Coast. "Bob Crocetta received the

2005 Citizen of the Year Award at the City of Palm Coast 6<sup>th</sup> Birthday Celebration in January 2006. Bob has consistently been Palm Coast's model citizen in all the years since his active participation in the incorporation of our city. He attend the first City Council meeting and Workshop in 2000 and never missed either meeting until late 2006 when illness prevented him from continuing his unbroken record. He described many meetings when he was the only citizen there. Now we have pretty good crowds.

ITT had mostly departed Palm Coast in 1995 and thereafter the Civic Association helped combine a number of incorporation groups into one with a committee chaired by Jim Canfield and Marty McLean. Bob was soon completely immersed in the activities of the Palm Coast Home Rule Coalition and participated in planning sessions and a long series of public meetings in preparation for the vote on incorporation. Bob organized car trains, tooting horns and playing band music plus delivered scores of "Vote Yes" signs all over Palm Coast. He admited he enjoyed the personal contacts in front of Wal-Mart and Publix and at the Home Show the most. Bob was named by Flagler County to the 5 member transition team that guided the city before its formal incorporation date of December 31, 1999.

Bob has also been a mainstay of the City of Palm Coast Historical Society having served as Treasurer (with liberal assistance from Kathleen) from the time of the groups inception."

Note from Debby: I attended the meeting that Bob became Treasurer. Margaret Davie was President then and asked Bob "Will you be Treasurer?" Bob's response was "I will do whatever you want me to do Margaret." This statement from Bob speaks volumes about him—he was always ready to volunteer and help where he was needed!


